PRIMO VANTAGE F1 Cabbage

Get ready to make coleslaw! Primo Vantage delivers 4 to 4.5 - pound heads of sweet crunchy goodness in only 70-75 from transplant. The plants are well adapted to most areas of the country for spring or summer planting and hold well in the field or garden, giving you harvest flexibility. Heads have a short core, a fresh green color and resistance to Fusarium yellows race 1 as an added bonus. You can also plant with tighter spacing between plants in smaller areas without compromising quality. Primo Vantage is our favorite cabbage to snack on in our trials year after year and we think you will love it too!



DUQUESA F1 Nantes Carrot

Duquesa, (Spanish for duchess) is true royalty among carrots. The crisp, blunt-tipped roots are super flavorful and can be used fresh, pickled with jalapeños (a popular Mexican snack), or juiced. Duquesa, a Nantes type, has a sweet yet rich carrot flavor and bright orange, cylindrical roots that measure 6"-7" long by approximately 1.5" wide at the crown. The high quality root interior stays firm without woodiness and upright tops are bright green and well attached, making harvest a breeze. Expect maturity in 85-100 days from direct seeding.



LOLA F1 Sweet Banana Pepper

Bright shiny color, super yields and mild flavor make Lola sweet banana pepper a star. Fruits mature early on easy-to-grow plants that are widely adapted and disease resistant. Extra-large fruits are smooth and straight, measuring 7.5 - 8" long by 1.5 - 1.75" wide at the shoulder. Lola matures from light yellow to orange to bright red and is sweet and crunchy with firm, thick walls when picked at any stage. The plants are medium-tall, with good cover so fruit are protected from the elements. Expect maturity in about 65-70 days from transplant. HR: Xcv: 0-3, 7, 8 \ IR: TSWV



FIRE FRESH F1 Swiss Chard

Light up your salad with Fire Fresh Swiss chard baby greens! Fire Fresh has bright red stems (petioles) and vivid green leaves that add bold color to baby leaf salads, spring mixes, or stir-fries. The crunchy leaves are round to oval with a slight texture. Fast-growing plants have an upright habit that keeps the leaves clean for harvest. Fire Fresh is flexible: harvest at baby size in about 25-35 days or at full leaf size in about 55-65 days. Swiss chard leaves hold their color and resist the leaf miner damage that discolors other leafy crops. Fire Fresh has a premium disease package: HR: Cb \ IR: Pfb 1.



DESPERADO F1 Hot Anaheim Pepper

The name Anaheim was coined by farmer Manuel Ortega, who brought a mild strain of green peppers from New Mexico to Anaheim, CA in 1894. Manuel would be proud of Desperado with its bold attitude and high yields. The plants are tall with good cover to protect harvests from the summer sun. Fruits are smooth and straight, measure about 7.5" long by 1.5" at the shoulder and are mostly 2 lobed. They are heavy for their size with medium wall thickness. Harvest green in about 70 days from transplant. Very mild heat measures 350-600 scovilles. Fruits can be used fresh or preserved dry or in oil or vinegar.



GRAN CARIBE F1 Hot Santa Fe Pepper

Named after a native Caribbean tribe, Gran Caribe brings color, flavor, and heat to the garden. Extra-large, conical fruits have thick walls and start a lovely ivory color, then transition to orange and mature to rich red. The plants are big and full, and are highly ornamental, displaying fruit in several colors at the same time. Continual harvests promote fruit set on the super-productive plants. The first broad shouldered, jumbo-sized (2" by 5") fruit turn ivory about 65-68 days from transplant. Expect a scoville rating of 3500-6500 depending on soil conditions. Gran Caribe is pungent and has outstanding fruit firmness that holds well after harvesting.



CAMARO F1 Slicing Tomato

Camaro races through the hottest summer while other plants slow down. The compact determinate plants set high yields of deep red, 8 to 10 ounce, smooth, glossy, globe-shaped fruit throughout the summer starting about 72-75 days from transplant. Camaro is a good fit for large containers or raised beds and can be transplanted later in the summer to extend your harvest into fall; no pruning is required. Plants are hearty, and have good cover and disease resistance. HR: Aal / Fol: 1-3 / Vd: 1 \ IR: Ss / TYLCV: Is
