

Summer/Round types are thicker and harder; best used for coleslaw, salads, and cooking (like Primo Vantage & Stonehead).

Winter/Storage types are thicker and firmer; best used for coleslaw, soups and stews. Storage types can be kept in the refrigerator or root cellar for long periods of time and eaten during the winter months (like Storage #4).

#### **DUQUESA** Carrot

Duquesa (Spanish for duchess), is true royalty among carrots. The crisp, blunt-tipped roots are full of flavor and can be used fresh, pickled or juiced. Duquesa, a Nantes type, has bright orange, cylindrical roots that measure 6"-7" long by approximately 1.5" wide at the crown. The high quality root interior stays firm without woodiness and upright tops are bright green and well attached, making harvest a breeze.



#### INGOT Carrot

Ingot is a long Nantes hybrid with both high color and flavor. It has received highest marks for its "sweet flavor and texture" in trial taste tests. Ingot is an ideal choice for home garden and specialty markets. Its high carotene levels of 120–170 ppm are evident in the deep exterior/ interior color.



#### OLYMPUS Carrot

Olympus is a cello-type that is outstanding for bunching. It has great color combined with a smooth finish. The taste is outstanding with a very crisp texture. Olympus is very uniform. Yield potential is high with this classy carrot.







#### TRITON Carrot

Triton is known for its superb taste and texture. Strongly attached, erect tops enable easier harvest of the extra-long roots (9-10 inches long and .5-1 inch in diameter.) Roots are medium-orange and cylindrical in shape with a semi-blunt tip.

#### FUERTE Carrot

This carrot is known for its nice uniform shape with strong tops. Fuerte offers high yields as well as blunt tip with some shoulder. The tops are tall and medium green in color. Roots are cylindrical in shape and medium orange in color. Fuerte is an excellent Nantes variety that compares favorably to other Nantes types.

#### NEPTUNE Carrot

Neptune Imperator carrot is a snap to grow and a treat to eat. The heavy roots average from 8-10 inches in length with a 1.6 inch shoulder and tapered shape, have bright orange color, and sweet flavor. Neptune matures early to mid-season but holds well until you harvest. Neptune works well in a variety of growing conditions.





### Cucumber • Eggplant



#### TASTY GREEN Cucumber

A highly popular Japanese slicing-type cucumber and a home garden industry standard. Exterior is dark green with shallow ridges and small white spines, while interior is crisp and white. Fruit grows to about 9 inches long and 1.5 inches in diameter, and has tender skin and a nice mild flavor. Matures early in about 60 days from seeding. Resistant to powdery mildew and intermediately resistant to downy mildew. Organic and non-organic seeds available.



#### SLICE MORE Cucumber

Slice More is a high quality slicing cucumber, with uniform, 8.5 inch fruits. Dark green, smooth skin protects a crisp flesh with a very small seed cavity. Plants are easy to grow and withstand varied conditions. The heavy yielding vines produce early (about 63 days from seeding) and continue well into the season. Shows high resistance to scab and intermediate resistance to cucumber mosaic virus, anthracnose races 1 & 3, downy mildew and powdery mildew.



Shikou is a hybrid Asian-type eggplant. The dark purple, glossy, elongated fruit measure 6-8 inches long by 1-1.5 inches wide, with a purple calyx (or stem), and tender, thin skin. Medium-sized plants are very attractive and productive, producing loads of lavender blooms followed by semi-spineless fruits that mature about 70-80 days from transplant. Shikou is a Japanese word meaning "Supreme." Fruits boast a bright white interior with few seeds and are easy to prepare – just slice and sauté or stir-fry. No peeling or salting required. Produces continuously all summer long, often until first frost.

# Did you know?

A 1993 study published in the New England Journal of Medicine revealed that eggplant contains higher levels of nicotine than any other vegetable. Don't worry, you would have to sit down and eat between 20-40 pounds of it to consume the amount of nicotine in one cigarette.

Instead, enjoy a typical serving and benefit from the fact that Japanese eggplants also contain the healthy compounds nasunin, anthocyanin and chlorogenic acid, which function as antioxidants and anti-inflammatory agents.





#### SANTO Cilantro (Coriander)

A fast-growing, yet slow-bolting strain of this highly popular herb. A uniform selection with broad, highly-aromatic leaves that are sturdier than other strains. Multiple cuts can be made under long days. Use the leaves as the herb cilantro and harvest the seeds for the spice coriander. An industry standard variety. Monogerm seed available. Organic and nonorganic seeds available.



#### DUKAT Dill

Dukat produces much higher yields of foliage than other dill varieties. The dark green, ferny leaves also have a distinct, strong aroma that adds depth to any fish, vegetable or pasta dish. Vigorous plants eventually reach 30 to 40 inches tall and are topped with very large umbels. Suitable for summer culture as well as the typical spring and fall.



#### DARK GREEN ITALIAN Parsley

Our selection of this heirloom, flat-leaf parsley offers a broader leaf with more flavor than other varieties. The glossy, dark green, moderately cut leaves mature in 65-70 days and are well suited for both home garden and fresh market use. Cervia glides into warm summer weather delivering tasty salad greens in about 55 days. The compact plants are soft green with tight, Bibb/Butterhead style heads. The leaves are sweet and mild with a touch of crunch. At the baby/teen stage leaves are very round, have a narrow rib, and smooth surface and edges with a weighty texture.

#### CIELO VERDE Green Leaf

Cielo Verde is the industry standard for green leaf whole head production! Heads are large, upright, vigorous, and thick textured with good, bright green color. Cielo Verde is widely adapted to many growing conditions. Baby leaves have a frilly edge and a curvy shape and thick texture giving them substantial weight and loft.

Monterra, our most beautiful leaf lettuce, has a medium-large, dense head with deep green shiny leaves. Plants are upright, sturdy, very full and have a high leaf count. This variety has shown strong tolerance to bolting, as well as Corky Root and LNSV. Baby leaves are deep green, round, and slightly cupped with a frilly edge and attractive rib/leaf contrast. Monterra's slightly tangy flavor is complimented by a pleasant crunch.

## ZORRO Green Leaf

Zorro is a beautiful green leaf variety with a unique, glossy sheen and full, frilly leaves. Plants are early maturing and have shown strong field tolerance to bolting. The large (4" X 1.5") heavy fruit have a thick wall and mature from glossy green to deep red. Harvest early for fresh use or at mature red for sauce. Matures in 60–65 days from transplant.

#### JALAFUEGO Jalapeño

Our hottest jalapeño pepper! Jalafuego is a favorite for home gardens due to its high pungency fruit and strong plant that yields extremely large harvests throughout a long season. Plants perform well in containers or in the garden. The smooth, very dark green fruit has extra length that makes it perfect for growing conditions that may cause fruit to shorten.

#### SPICY SLICE Jalapeño

Spicy Slice delivers uniform, bite-sized jalapeño rings right from the garden. The extra-large, uniformly cylindrical fruit have a medium pungency and thick wall suited to slicing and fresh eating. #### TRIDENT Poblano

Trident is a superior extra-large poblano. Long, two-lobed fruits show excellent ability to size up in the northern US and Canada and produce multiple harvests in longer season areas. Continuously setting, vigorous plants are very widely adapted. Trident matures mid season from glossy deep green to red and is well suited for the fresh or drying markets. A good replacement for customers who formerly used Tiburon.







#### **CRACKLE** Finger Hot

Crackle will light up your garden like a bonfire! The tall, sturdy plant produces many leafy branches and sets continuously throughout the season. Crackle thrives in hot weather with an expansive root system and great leaf cover. Plants set loads of uniform, glossy, dark green conical-pointed 4-5 inch fruit that measure about 1/4 of an inch at the shoulder and are heavy for their type. Crackle has medium walls suited for either fresh use or drying. Pungency will vary depending on soil conditions. Fruits mature in about 80 days.



### DURANGO Guajilo

Durango, a Guajillo type hot pepper, can be eaten fresh or dried and ground into powder for making sauces, spreads, or rubs. It has mild to medium heat, approximately 2500-5000 scoville units depending on conditions. The 6.5 to 8 inch long fruits mature to red then dry to burgundy-black with excellent dry weight.

#### PATHFINDER Serrano

Pathfinder serrano blazes a trail to pepper bliss. Pepper breeding geniuses behind the scenes combined huge, thick-walled fruit with high yields and compact plants to bring you more fruit in less space. Just when we thought it could not get better they added early-mid maturity (78-80 days), deep green color and disease resistance. 
#### DESPERADO Anaheim

The name Anaheim was coined by farmer Manuel Ortega, who brought these peppers from New Mexico to Anaheim, California in 1894. #### SUREÑO Serrano

Sureño is a high producing, large, straight fruited serrano pepper with a medium-green color and excellent quality. The plant is more compact and the yield more concentrated than a traditional serrano. Sureño's fruit is very firm, with a solid core that can withstand rough handling.







#### KURIHOMARE Kabocha

Braveheart Hybrid is our favorite garden tomato! The rich red, approximately 1 ounce (28–30 grams). cherry tomatoes grow prolifically on well-behaved, indeterminate short-internode plants. Fruits are sweet and juicy but with a bold, rich tomato flavor reminiscent of big slicers. Although the skin is thin, the fruits resist cracking well. They also ripen quickly and uniformly, then continue for harvests throughout the season. Expect your first harvest about 60 days from transplant.



#### SWEET MILLION Cherry

Sweet Million is a well-established favorite in the home garden and roadside markets. It boasts a balanced, superb, classic cherry tomato flavor, and an early maturity (60 to 62 days from transplant). Fruits are very uniform, with an average weight of .5 ounce (10 to 15 grams). Indeterminate plants are easy to grow, have strong vigor and produce high yields of firm fruit that show good crack resistance.



#### SWEET GOLD Cherry

Sweet Gold is an excellent companion to the red-fruited Sweet Million. It is also a popular home garden favorite for its flavor and performance. Vigorous, indeterminate plants are very high yielding, producing single and double clusters of early-maturing fruits in about 62 to 65 days from transplant. The attractive, bright yellow fruits weigh around .5 ounces (10 to 15 grams) and boast a full, delicious flavor.



#### SWEET TREATS Cherry

Sweet Treats is a unique, large-fruited cherry tomato with multiple market options. Fruits are globe-shaped, have a beautiful deep pink tone, smooth texture and an excellent rich flavor. The fruit are sweet but crack resistant and all weigh about .5 ounce. We suggest gardeners grow 6 plants our more for the best color range.



#### RUBY CRUSH Grape

Ruby Crush is our newest determinate grape variety. Plant in either patio containers or the field, where it shines with clusters of candy red, sugary-acid balanced fruits that resist cracking. 


#### YELLOW BUTTERCUP Watermelon

#### SWEETIE PIE Watermelon



### DEFINITIONS OF TERMS USED TO DESCRIBE REACTIONS TO PATHOGENS, PESTS AND STRESSES

#### Immunity:
